The Bread of Life Revealed

When Jesus presented this teaching, He had just fed 5,000 people through the miracle multiplication of barley loaves. He fed them physical food.

What happened when Jesus presented this teaching?

John 6:60 tells us: *“Therefore many of His disciples, when they heard this, said, ‘This is a hard saying; who can understand it?’”*

What happened? John 6:66 says: *“From that time many of His disciples went back and walked with Him no more.”*

They left Jesus when they could not comprehend His teachings with their carnal minds and set beliefs.

But Peter recognized the spiritual value of Jesus’ teaching: *“Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.”* The words of eternal life!

Did He also give us the FOOD of eternal life?

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What's happened in current Christian thought regarding the Eucharist? Why has it been reduced to symbolism using goldfish crackers?

The Last Supper

In this Holy Week, we are here to celebrate the Passover... what do you truly believe? Was the Last Supper just symbolic? All 4 Gospels speak of the Eucharist, as well as Corinthians; so it must be of great importance!

The Breaking of the Bread is foundational to understanding the Cross. If the breaking of bread at the Last Supper is just symbolic, then why isn't the Cross just symbolic? The following Scriptures illuminate the power of the breaking of bread....

Luke 24:15-16 says: *“So it was, while they conversed and reasoned, that Jesus Himself drew near and went with them. But their eyes were restrained, so that they did not know Him.”*

Luke 24:30-31 continues: *“Now it came to pass, as He sat at the table with them, that He took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they knew Him; and He vanished from their sight.”*

Acts 2:42 says: *“And they continued steadfastly in the apostles’ doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers.”*

Acts 2:46 reiterates: *“So continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house...”*

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Jesus as the Bread of Life is foretold many ways in the Scriptures.

Jesus is the Word Made Flesh

- ◆ John 1:14 proclaims Jesus' entry into the world: "*And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.*"
- ◆ The Word of God is eternal, beyond time and space, incorruptible.

Incorruptible Word-Made-Flesh Eucharistic Miracles

- ◆ Faverney, France, 1608. A Host survives a fire completely intact.
- ◆ Marseille-en-Beauvais, France, 1533. A Host remains intact buried in a snow storm.
- ◆ Paris, France, 1290. A man who hated the Faith stole a Consecrated Host. He stabbed it with a knife and it began to bleed. He threw it in a fire and it jumped out of the fire. He put it in boiling water and it came out and formed a cross. Finally giving up, he returned it to the church.

Jesus is the Body & Blood of the Eucharist

- ◆ In John 6:55 Jesus tells us that He is the Body and Blood of the Eucharist: "*For My flesh is food indeed, and My blood is drink indeed.*" *INDEED.*¹ As the Body and Blood of the Eucharist, He is food for eternal life.

¹ The Hebrew word "umnam" is used to express certainty or affirmation.

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Body & Blood Eucharistic Miracles

- ◆ Tixtla, Mexico, 2006. The presence of blood in the Host; verifying human AB blood and human heart tissue.
- ◆ Buenos Aires, 1996. Tissue from the Consecrated Host verified as human cardiac muscle tissue, from a man who died an extremely painful death. The tissue cells were still alive in 2005, nine years after the event.
- ◆ Lanciano, Italy, 750 AD. When a doubting priest consecrated the Host, it transformed into flesh and blood. The flesh is cardiac tissue containing arterioles, veins, and nerve fibers. The blood type is AB.
- ◆ There are numerous scientifically verified Eucharistic miracles where the blood type is AB positive. It has never been any other blood type.
- ◆ This is the same blood type found on the Ark of the Covenant discovery by Ron Wyatt. Always AB positive, known as the “universal receiver” blood type.

The Food of Eternal Life

- ◆ Jesus teaches in parables but also in very direct, even blunt, terms. In John Chapter 6, Jesus presents himself as the Bread of Life, a new manna. He is NOT speaking in parable here.
- ◆ In John 6:27 He says: *“Do not labor for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to everlasting life, which the Son of Man will give you, because God the Father has set His seal on Him.”*

Eternal Life Eucharistic Miracles

- ◆ Many illustrious Christians lived long periods of time sustained only by the Eucharist (Consecrated Host). These are all well documented.

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- ◆ A Brazilian laywoman Servant of God Lola Floripes de Jesús, lived on only the Eucharist for 60 years!

Jesus as the New “Bread of Presence”

- ◆ Exodus 25:30 instructs: *“Place the Bread of the Presence on the table to remain before me at all times.”*
- ◆ Jesus Christ was born in Bethlehem, which means “the house of bread,” a clue of His coming as the Bread of Presence of the New Covenant. The Bread of Presence is now the Consecrated Host on display, representing the Presence of Jesus in a place of worship.

The “Bread of Presence” Eucharistic Miracles

- ◆ Lourdes, France, 1888. The procession of the Blessed Sacrament spontaneously heals the sick; countless have been healed since then with the annual procession.
- ◆ Marseille-en-Beauvais, France, 1533. Several healings including a paralyzed monk and a blind man.
- ◆ An islander parish was facing a life-threatening tsunami. Followed by a group of the faithful, the priest marched to the edge of the ocean waters and presented the Blessed Sacrament (Consecrated Host) in the monstrance to the violent sea. It miraculously abated and left the islanders safe and sound.
- ◆ Italy, 1240. Facing an attack by Saracen soldiers, renowned renunciate St. Clare marched out with the Consecrated Host in the monstrance and presented Him before the invaders. Utterly shaken by what they had witnessed, the savages fled the scene.

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Jesus as Eucharistic Lord

- ◆ On His last Passover with His Disciples, Jesus breaks bread and raises the cup presenting them as His Body and Blood that shall redeem humanity. He presents himself as the High Priest of the New Covenant.
- ◆ Matthew 26:26-28 describes this scene: *“And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, ‘Take, eat; this is My body.’ Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, ‘Drink from it, all of you. For this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins.’”*
- ◆ 1 Corinthians 11:26 says: *“For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death till He comes.”*
- ◆ Hebrews 8:1-2 proclaims: *“We do have such a high priest, who sat down at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in heaven, and who serves in the sanctuary, the true tabernacle set up by the Lord, not by a mere human being.”*
- ◆ As Eucharistic Lord, Jesus presides over the consecration and transubstantiation of the Bread and Wine. It is this transubstantiation that can explain how a simple piece of wheat can be transformed into cardiac tissue and human blood, and possess other supernatural qualities.

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The Blood of the New Covenant

- ◆ In Matthew 26:27-28, Jesus raises the 3rd Passover Cup, which is the Cup of Salvation, *Yeshua*: “*Then He took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, ‘Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins.’*”
- ◆ Numerous Eucharistic Miracles involve blood showing up in the Consecrated Host and it is always AB positive blood. The Host has frequently turned into a bloody heart tissue or had blood show up in the Host. The blood is alive.

Ponder In Your Heart

- ◆ Why is God giving us these miracles?
- ◆ Was Jesus’ sacrifice on the Cross only symbolic?
- ◆ If you accept that even some of the 100’s of Eucharistic Miracles are true, how might that affect or change your relationship with Jesus? Your understanding of Him and what He has given the world?
- ◆ How are these miracles dismissed if He is showing up in different countries, cultures, continents, across a 1300-year span, as the Bread of Life and the Blood of Salvation?
