◆ And Proverbs 15:32 instructs: "Whoever ignores instruction despises himself, but he who listens to reproof gains intelligence." Help me Father God, to humbly hear with my heart feedback that will make me a better person, a better Christian.

# You Discipline to Save Us

- ◆ Dear Heavenly Father, it's hard to remember in the midst of suffering, trials, tests and corrective discipline, that You discipline us to save us from a painful destiny. This is truly compassionate love.
- ◆ As Your Word in Hebrews 10:26-27 declares: "For if we go on deliberately and willingly sinning after once acquiring the knowledge of the Truth, there is no longer any sacrifice left to atone for [our] sins [no further offering to which to look forward]. [There is nothing left for us then] but a kind of awful and fearful prospect and expectation of divine judgment and the fury of burning wrath and indignation which will consume those who put themselves in opposition [to God]."
- ◆ Abba Father, Your Word in Hebrews Chapter 12 encourages me and consoles me that there are beautiful fruits to your discipline, your pruning me of my flaws, iniquities and bad habits.

◆ Looking back at the times I have been truly tested and squeezed like a lemon, I now see how those experiences purified and strengthened my character. I now see how it was your lovingkindness, not some cruelty, that caused You to bring those difficult experiences to me.
